

RESULT CLAUSES (also called Consecutive Clauses)

- ut + any Subjunctive

Something happens in such a way that something else happens.

Common 'signpost' words are:

tam

talis,-is,-e

tantus,-a,-um

tot

ita

adeo

adeo istam domum cupio ut multum argenti abstulerim.

ut **does not change** to ne in Result Clauses:

e.g. tot amicos habebat ut numquam pecunia deesset.

tantum vini biberat ut non advenerit.

Further examples:

1. tam defessus sum ut statim obdormire velim.
2. tantum erat aedificium ut diu arderet.
3. tot milites vidimus ut quam celerrime fugeremus.

PURPOSE CLAUSES

(also called Final Clauses)

Revise the Present and Imperfect Subjunctives

- **ut** + Imperfect or Present Subjunctive
milites vigilaverunt ut iussa legati perficerent.
miles vigilavit ut iussa centurionum perficiat.

- **ne** + Imperfect or Present Subjunctive
captivus fugit ne se interficerent.

- **ne quis** **ne quid**
iste nobis hoc consilium dedit ne cui idem rursus fieret.

domi mansimus ne quid mali accideret.

- **Relative Pronoun (qui, quae etc.) or Relative Adverb (e.g. ubi)**
frumentum quaerebat quod consumerent.

Antonius quo se verteret non habebat.

praetor stabat ubi cuncta videret.

- **quo** is used instead of **ut** if the Purpose Clause contains a comparative adjective or adverb
moenia fecerunt quo facilius Romam defendere possent.

- instead of **et ne** or **aut ne**, **neve** or **neu** are used.

INDIRECT COMMAND

- *iubeo* or *veto* + the Present Infinitive

milites iussit urbem expugnare.

consul eos hic manere vetuit.

- Other verbs: *impero suadeo persuadeo rogo posco oro moneo*
ut or ne + Present or Imperfect Subjunctive

ei persuasimus ne ita se gereret.

te oraverunt ut patri parceres.

te oraverunt ut pater superesset.

Adjectives - Comparatives and Superlatives

1. No one is braver than Camillus.
2. No one is braver than Camillus.
3. Horatius was the bravest of all the citizens.
4. My master's toga is very small. It is smaller than Sextus'. It is longer than yours. (*your=tuus*)
5. The farmer's roof is more beautiful than mine.
6. The farmers' horse is more beautiful than me.
7. The barbarians had very swift horses.
8. I have never seen braver soldiers than you, Romans.
9. Iron is more useful than gold.
10. Honour is better than iron.
11. Therefore gold is worse than honour.
12. Very many of the Romans feared the elephants.
13. The elephants were very big and very fierce.
14. I have more money than you. (*plus in the singular is always neuter and is followed by a Partitive Genitive*)
15. I have more slaves than slave-girls.
16. The Senate has given more honours to Pompeius than to Caesar.
17. Nero was very similar to his father. (*similis+Genitive*)
18. This is very easy.
19. That war was very difficult.
20. Sextus is the cleverest of the boys, but Vipsania is cleverer than him.

Adverbs

1. Generally **Adverbs** are formed from **Adjectives**.

If the Adjective is **1/2**, the Adverb ends in **-e**

If it is **3rd**, the Adverb ends in **-ter**

The **Comparatives** and the **Superlatives** of Adverbs are formed from the equivalent **Adjectives**.
